The United Empire Loyalists: Early Settlers of Ontario

Jo Ann Tuskin will give her Loyalist Lady presentation about her family's journey including the who, where and why of the migration and settlement.

Jo Ann Tuskin became interested in her Scottish heritage while doing her family tree at Toronto Teachers' College in the early 1960s and is currently the Secretary of two Scottish groups.

Jo Ann earned her BA and BEd from York University in Toronto while teaching full-time. After retirement, she taught kindergarten in Turkey at a private international school for four years. She currently is an occasional teacher for the Toronto Catholic District School Board – a teaching career that spans over 60 years! Jo Ann's ancestors are United Empire Loyalists (refugees from the Revolutionary War). In 2008 she provided the documentary proof to the United Empire Loyalists' Association of Canada and is entitled to use the post-nominal initials, UE, for Unity of Empire – the only hereditary title allowed in Canada!

Jo Ann also does classroom presentations about the Loyalists and wears her historic costume at every opportunity.

Women Are Still Second Class Citizens

Janis Daly probes the inequities that persist worldwide concerning the status of women.

Janis Daly has been a member of Don Heights Unitarian Congregation since 2011. She has served on the Board and is active on several committees. She is a Lay Chaplain and a Lay Minister at Don Heights. A former adult trainer, she is a Distinguished Toastmaster with many speeches to her credit. **Janis** is also a singer-songwriter, an enthusiastic member of the Don Heights Singers and various bands.

Currently a resident of Nanaimo, for decades singer-songwriter **Tony Turner** honed his song craft in the Ottawa folk music scene. *Circle of Song*, **Tony's** signature anthem of unity, is sung far and wide and is published in the popular *Rise Again* folk songbook. In 2015, **Tony's** politically charged singalong *Harperman* became a YouTube hit, the centerpiece of rallies across Canada and garnered the writer a *Spirit of Folk* award from Folk Alliance International.

She participated in sit-ins in the US, planted fruit trees in central Mexico to bolster the incomes of Indigenous people, painted houses for Inuit victims of TB in the Canadian Arctic, and much, much more. She has travelled all over the world, photographing and writing about her travels. She is now active in the Society of Friends in Toronto.
