November 3 at 10:30 am Bob's War

Presenter: John Sproule **Service Leader:** John Kennedy **Music:** Curated

As we approach Remembrance Day, John Sproule remembers the experiences of his father, Robert "Bob" Stanley Sproule, in World War 2. Bob had a variety of wartime experiences: from civilian worker and fleeing refugee in wartime France, to RCAF ground crew in Canada, Newfoundland, Britain and France, to US Army Intelligence in France and Germany. All of it was documented in dozens of letters home, accompanied by photographs. His family preserved it all, and it forms the basis for today's talk.

John Sproule has been a member at Don Heights since 1995, where he is known for his slide shows filled with short UU biographies. His father Bob was not a Unitarian, but **John** has stepped outside his comfort zone to present his unusual tale.

November 17 at 10:30 am Banning Books to Save Children From Harm

This talk takes up the recent rise in book banning in two very different contexts: specifically, among the efforts of Florida-based parent's rights groups who push to ban books by sexual and racial minorities, and among educators in Ontario who are "weeding" books that do not adhere to progressive orthodoxy. We'll think about how both of these groups resort to censorship in order to prevent "harm" to children, and will further consider book banning as a form of symbolic violence.

Dr. Ira Wells is a critic, essayist, and an associate professor at Victoria College in the University of Toronto, where he serves as Academic Programs Director and teaches in the Northrop Frye stream in literature and the humanities in the Vic One program. His writing has appeared in *The Atlantic*, the *Globe and Mail*, *The Guardian*, *The New Republic*, and many other venues. His next book, *On Book Banning*, is out February, 2025.
